Rubrika *Članci* sadrži 13 radova, rubrika *Prikazi* sedam radova, rubrika *Izveštaji* jedan rad i rubrika *Aktivnosti Centra za istraživanje moderne i savremene historije Tuzla*, jedan rad. U Časopisu su, dakle, objavljena 22 rada. Svi radovi su recenzirani i kategorizirani. Objavljeni radovi tretiraju važna pitanja iz moderne i savremene historije Bosne i Hercegovine.

Autori su odabrali aktuelne i važne teme. Do rezultata istraživanja, koje su vrlo jasno prikazali, došli su koristeći historijske izvore različite provenijencije. Osim toga, autori su u svojim radovima donijeli više stotina fusnota i time omogućili provjerljivost što i jeste jedno od obilježja znanstvenog rada.

FOREWORD

Dear friends of scientific thought, dear collaborators! In front of us is the sixth issue of the journal *Historical Views*. This is the result of the continuous work of the Center for Research of Modern and Contemporary History Tuzla and associates of the Journal. The authors of the papers and the Editorial Board tried to make this issue of the Journal high quality and meaningful. And the fact that the quality of the Journal is indisputable is confirmed by the fact that it is indexed in 35 international scientific and bibliographic databases.

The sixth issue of the journal *Historical Views* contains sections *Articles*, *Reviews*, *Conference Reports* and *Activities of the Center for Research of Modern and Contemporary History Tuzla*. In addition, there is a *list of publications* published by the Center for Research of Modern and Contemporary History Tuzla, and *Instructions to authors*.

The *Articles* section contains 13 papers, the *Reviews* section of seven papers, the *Conference Reports* section, one paper and the *Activities of the Center for Research of Modern and Contemporary History Tuzla* section, one paper. Thus, 22 papers were published in the Journal. All papers are reviewed and categorized. The published papers address important issues from the modern and contemporary history of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

In the *Articles* section, papers are published that address the following research issues: *School opportunities in the area of Bosanska Krupa and its surroundings during the Austro-Hungarian administration* (Mirza Ahmetbašić); *War and humanity in historical perspective: Bosniak experiences in Sandžak in 1941* (Safet Bandžović); *State policy of separating priests of the Catholic Church in Bosnia and Herzegovina into „positive“ and „reactionary“ /1945-1963/* (Denis Bećirović); *Informbiro crisis and Bosnia and Herzegovina /1948-1956/ in historical sources and historiography* (Jasmin Jajčević); *Bosnia and Herzegovina in the political orbit of Karadjordjevo and Tikves* (Adnan Velagić); *Dayton peace agreement – The end of great state claims?* (Meldijana Arnaut Haseljić); *Political and military circumstances in Tuzla-Podrinje canton in the year of the Dayton peace* (Izet Hadžić, Ahmed Hadžić); *Preventing return: Implementation of Annex VII of the Dayton peace agreement in Bosnia and Herzegovina /1995-2020/* (Sead Selimović); *Bosnia and Herzegovina in current Serbian and Croatian political conceptions* (Omer Hamzić); *The post-Dayton search for justice: War crimes trials in Bosnia and Herzegovina before competent courts* (Vedad Gurda, Dževad Mahmutović, Maja Iveljić); *The Dayton controversies - public decision-making between parliamentary democracy and partitocracy* (Emir Tahirović, Ermin Kuka); *The importance of non-governmental organizations in public policy-making in Bosnia and Herzegovina in the time after the Dayton agreement* (Hazim Okanović); *The phenomenon of fragile states: Bosnia and Herzegovina* (Sead Bandžović).

The authors have chosen current and important topics. The results of the research, which they presented very clearly, were obtained using historical sources of different provenance. In addition, the authors have brought hundreds of footnotes in their works, thus enabling verifiability, which is one of the features of scientific work.

The *Reviews* section contains two editions printed in 2020 and five editions printed in 2021. The authors of the „review“ are: Semir Hadžimusić, Ibrahim Kabil, Izet Šabotić, Sait Š. Šabotić, Alen Zečević, Emina Mostić and Omer Merzić.

In the *Conference Reports* section, Emir Šečić wrote the Report from the Scientific Conference “Srebrenica scholars and their role in the spiritual and social life of Bosniaks”, which was held in Srebrenica, on July 6, 2021.

In this issue, the journal *Historical Views* presented facts about the activities of the Center for Research of Modern and Contemporary History Tuzla in 2020, a *list of publications* published by the Center for Research of Modern and Contemporary History Tuzla, and *Instructions to authors*.
